WORD

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song.

FIRST READING: 2 Kings 5:1-3, 7-15c

Naaman, a Syrian general, suffers from leprosy. In this passage Elisha miraculously cures his illness, but only after Naaman realizes, with the help of his servants, that he also needs healing for his pride. This foreign general then acknowledges the sovereignty of the God of Israel.

¹Naaman, commander of the army of the king of Aram, was a great man and in high favor with his master, because by him the LORD had given victory to Aram. The man, though a mighty warrior, suffered from leprosy. ²Now the Arameans on one of their raids had taken a young girl captive from the land of Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. ³She said to her mistress, "If only my lord were with the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy." ⁷When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, "Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his leprosy? Just look and see how he is trying to pick a quarrel with me."

But when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, he sent a message to the king, "Why have you torn your clothes? Let him come to me, that he may learn that there is a prophet in Israel." So Naaman came with his horses and chariots, and halted at the entrance of Elisha's house. Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, "Go, wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored and you shall be clean." But Naaman became angry and went away, saying, "I thought that for me he would surely come out, and stand and call on the name of the LORD his God, and would wave his hand over the spot, and cure the leprosy! Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them, and be clean?" He turned and went away in a rage. But his servants approached and said to him, "Father, if the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, would you not have done it? How much more, when all he said to you was, 'Wash, and be clean'?" So he went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God; his flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and he was clean.

^{15a-c}Then he returned to the man of God, he and all his company; he came and stood before him and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel."

SECOND READING: 2Timothy2:8-15

Though Paul is chained as a prisoner, he reminds Timothy that the word of God is never shackled or confined. He encourages his young friend to proclaim that word of freedom in an honest and upright life as well as in his teaching and preaching.

⁸Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David—that is my gospel, ⁹for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. ¹⁰Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory. ¹¹The saying is sure:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;

¹²if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he will also deny us;


¹³if we are faithless, he remains faithful—

for he cannot deny himself.

¹⁴Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening. ¹⁵Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

P: Dear Friends in Christ, it wasn't so long ago that you stood with a baby in your arms and made a sacred promise to God on behalf of your child to

I ask you to recommit to the promises you've already made to God on behalf of your child.

I ask you parents in the presence of God, this congregation, and your child will you continue in the promises you made to God in their baptism? If so, please answer, "Yes, with the help of God."

Parents: Yes, with the help of God.

At your child's baptism, the Church welcomed Madison and Mykaela into God's family. And committed to help raise these children in the Christian faith. I now ask you, People of God, do you promise to continue to support Madison and Mykaela and pray for them in their life in Christ?

If so please answer, "We do, with the help of God."

Congregation: We do, with the help of God

At this time we welcome you, Madison and Mykaela to that period of preparation known as catechism, a time when the church partners with your parents to provide for instruction in the Christian faith. It is a new beginning for you as you prepare to claim the promises of baptism for yourself.

As a sign of the beginning of this time of instruction I ask your parents to present you with a Study Bible, a gift from the people here at St. John to you. May it help you grow in faith and understanding.

P: Parents, fulfilling your promise made at her baptism, please place in your child's hands the Holy Scriptures, place your right hand on it, and your left hand on your child's shoulder.

Look them in the eyes and repeat after me:

May this Word of God... be a lamp to your feet... and a light to your path... and may the Living Word of God... shine in all you do and say.

The Lord be with you, and also with you.

Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you have given your daughters new birth, cleanse *them* from sin, and raise them to eternal life. Sustain these new confirmands with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, now and forever. **Amen**.

Madison /Mykaela, Child of God, Receive the + sign of the cross, a sign of God's endless love and mercy for you.


who on this day overcame death and the grave,


