Dear friends in Christ,

We have enjoyed a long Epiphany season this year, but now at the beginning of March, Lent is upon us. It is an intentional time of self-examination and reflection as we ready ourselves for Holy week and Easter. In the ancient church it was a time of preparation for Baptism, which makes it a perfect time to reflect on the promises and calling of our own baptism as we focus on our relationship with God and others.

I am reminded of promises parents make at the baptism of their children that are reaffirmed at confirmation, that we shall, "proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace." Recently in Bible Study we were looking at the Ten Commandments and I noticed you can find this emphasis lived out in Luther's explanation of the fifth commandment (You shall not murder) where he writes, "we neither endanger nor harm the lives of our neighbors, but instead help and support them in all of life's needs."

This year during Lent we will be participating in "40 Days of Giving" as special opportunity to learn about and serve the needs of our neighbors on issues of justice, hunger and sustainability both in the United States and abroad. Elsewhere in this newsletter are details about this emphasis, which will connect Sunday worship with our Wednesday Lenten soup supper study and offer an opportunity for the tradition Lenten practice of almsgiving, as we participate in a month long special offering toward ELCA World Hunger.

This is a busy time in the life of St. John: we have the Spaghetti Dinner coming up on March 11, there are plans to begin a new monthly kid's program, we have the Easter Surprise outreach event on April 8th and the celebrations of Holy Week. In the midst of all this, may we take the time to rest and prayerfully reflect in this Lenten season on why we do all that we do: the power of God's love through Jesus the Christ, and our calling to share that love.

Let us pray,

O God, our leader and guide, in the waters of baptism you bring us to new birth to live as your children. Strengthen our faith in your promises, that by your Spirit we may lift up your life to all the world through your Son, Jesus Christ Amen. (prayer of the day for the second Sunday in Lent)

Lent is traditionally a time of fasting. Through the prophet Isaiah, God reveals to us the depth and breadth of authentic fasting in the alternate reading for Ash Wednesday: "Is not this the fast I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?" (Isaiah 58:6).

This Lent we will participate in the World Hunger emphasis **40 days of Giving**, a special opportunity to lift up the church's hunger and poverty ministry. The goal is to raise \$1 million from across the ELCA during Lent to help give our brothers and sisters around the world opportunities to earn a fair, sustainable living with dignity. Information will be shared during worship and you will have the opportunity to support this ministry with your special offerings. In addition, we will be collecting loose change in the greeting area all during Lent, and the children will each receive special banks to collect their own offering.



Wednesday, *March 1 is Ash Wednesday*. We will have Holy Communion and Distribution of Ashes at *Noon and at 7:00 pm.*



Soup Suppers and Study

On Wednesday evenings March 8, 15, 22, 29, and April 5, join us as at 6:00 pm as we gather to set up and have fellowship before a soup supper at 6:30 pm.

The meal will be followed by a devotional study that will help us explore how our Lutheran faith shapes our perspective and role in the economy. Each of the five weeks we will look at on key aspect of the economy and explore questions related to economic justice and faith.

Purple Pancake Breakfast Sunday, March 5



Join us for our traditional Purple Pancake Breakfast for the beginning of Lent. This will be held between services on March 5.

If you wish, you may wear purple to be even more festive!



Scripture calls the church to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and care for the sick as Jesus says, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:31-46) and describes how the early church cared for one another and "distributed to each as any had need." (Act 2:45), so that there was not a needy person among them. (Acts 4:35) It is consistent with our call to be the people of God in the place to create a means that St. John can assist

those in our congregation and community that are in need. Local agencies are very effective at helping in certain circumstances but not all, and it seems appropriate to have a mechanism to do that when other avenues fail.

Last fall the congregation council approved establishing a special fund with its own bank account and specific guidelines to serve as a pastor's discretionary fund called the "Good Samaritan Fund" for those in need. The account was established in January. The fund will be sustained by special designated giving specifically to the fund. No general funds from the congregation will be used, so it is dependent on your needed special contributions.

This special fund shall provide an immediate means to assist financially or provide resources while maintaining essential confidentiality for those in need. Only the pastor and treasurer of the congregation will know the recipient of assistance.

If you wish to give an offering to help establish this fund giving, please designate that on the memo line of a check.
