Dear friends in Christ,

Over Lent, I had the privilege to work with our confirmation class on the Stations of the Cross presentation they provided for Good Friday worship. It was a lot of fun as they participated with enthusiasm. This month the youth are having a "Lock In" on May 10th- a night of fun, fellowship, and worship. Each month on the last Friday the younger ones of the congregation have the opportunity to participate in Kid's Cluban evening of music, story, games and craft that connect to their faith. It is a high-energy enjoyable time for all! Active participation of young people in faith building activities among their peers outside of worship may be one of the most crucial parts of helping them grow in faith. If they are not already a part of these activities I encourage you to bring them.

Another way to provide life changing faith formation opportunities is to have your child or grandchild go to Camp Lutherlyn. As their website says, "For more than seventy years Lutherlyn has been combining the love of God, fun, friends, swimming, playing in the woods, adventure challenges, Bible study, worship, cookouts, campfires, discoveries in nature, games, and a few surprises into an unforgettable experience!" As children and youth interact with staff and one another in this outdoor ministry setting they grow in faith in amazing ways.

There are a variety of programs from pre-school day programs, to day camps, half-week and a variety of weeklong camps for children from first grade to seniors in high school. My daughter enjoyed both Classic Camp and Horse Camp when she was young, but there are Rocketry, Adventurers, Musical Theater, Night Owls, and more. St. John has funds set aside specifically to help with camp scholarships and Lutherlyn promises "never to turn a child away from the opportunity to grow stronger in their faith because of financial circumstances." Cost should not be a deterrent.

On <u>Saturday, May 11th</u> beginning with opening worship at 11:00, Lutherlyn is hosting a free day to visit the camp and enjoy all camp has to offer. Bring the family, enjoy the day, and consider having your children experience one of the programs available this summer. Stewardship of community

You shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the Lord. **–Leviticus 19:18b** And who is my neighbor? **–Luke 10:29b**

Think of all the homes, apartments and condos within walking (or easy driving) distance of our congregation. Now ask, how do we interact with these neighbors? Does our congregation understand their issues, joys, opportunities and challenges? How can we love them as ourselves?

Though God has filled the world with neighbors for us to love, we have a special opportunity and responsibility with neighbors who are nearby us. They form our immediate community. Many congregations narrowly define "community" as people who are already part of church, but God calls us to broaden our vision.

Congregations across our denomination are finding renewed energy and purpose by connecting (or reconnecting) with their community neighbors. It takes work and a willingness to go outside our comfort zone, but worth the effort pays off for them and us.

"It's within our power to become good neighbors, to care for the people around us and to be cared for by the people around us," write Jay Pathak and Dave Runyon in *The Art of Neighboring* (2012, Baker Books, p. 22), a handy guide for a church to start a neighboring movement. "There really is a different way to live, and we are finding that it is actually the best way to live."

Loving our neighbors we naturally gather together as community that is blessed by God. It holds true in our personal lives as well as our congregations. As spring and summer unfolds, let's commit to finding ways to be better stewards of our community, engaging our neighbors, especially those who live closest to our congregation.

Camp Blast at Lutherlyn May 11, 2019 11am - 4:30 pm


