toiletry bags for the 75+ people who are served by this organization. From now until October, we, along with Kim's work family and MUP, are going to do a collection drive to provide much needed items for the homeless to help them as the weather turns colder. Worship Notes

The Order of Service

You may have noticed that we have been **trying some different things in worship in recent weeks**. Sometimes it's a new song or a different order of already familiar elements. Sometimes it's something totally different like streamers in worship! As Lutherans we do not have a prescribed worship service. **We are free to worship and praise God in a number of ways**. By exploring just a few of the different expressions of worship, we open ourselves to welcome and appreciate the rich diversity of God's church.

As Lutherans, "worship stands at the center of our life of faith and it nurtures us for our work in the world through God's word, water, bread, and prayer." "Worship unites us in celebration, engages us in thoughtful dialogue, and helps us grow in faith. It grounds us in our Christian and Lutheran roots, while demonstrating practical relevance for today's world." "Central to our worship life is the presence of God through word and sacrament." "There is also a basic pattern for worship among Lutherans. We gather. We encounter God's word. We share a meal at the Lord's table. And we are sent into the world." What words and songs and specific elements we use as we gather around God's word and table and as we are sent into the world may be different each week. But what always stays the same is our celebration of worship as an encounter with God, who saves us through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. (quotes taken from elca.org/worship)

From the Wider Church

SWPA Synod Assembly



In June, the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA held its annual Synod Assembly. Synod Assemblies are the highest legislative authority of the synod. The decisions made impact each of the 151 congregations of the synod. Representatives from each congregation are invited to take part in this important process and offer their voice and vote to each item on the agenda.

This year's theme was "I love to tell the story." The devotionals, the Friday night worship, even most of the reports focused on how we, as a synod and as a people of God, tell the story of the Gospel. Rev. Michael Curry, Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church kicked off the assembly with a keynote address. His message: Share love and we share the Gospel. Build relationships and the differences become something to embrace. Be willing to reach out to those you do not know, learn about them, understand them, and love them.

Synod council is working to restructure the synod to better meet the needs of the church today. The Synod Council proposed five Standing Committees of the synod: Care and Leadership for Congregations, Care and Leadership for Rostered Ministers, Care and Leadership for All Generations, Church in Society, and Church Throughout the World. You are invited to offer your feedback on this restructuring through the synod website. If you'd like assistance finding more information on the restructuring and/or the feedback form, contact Pastor Katie.

Rev. Carmelo Santos, Director for Theological Diversity and Ecumenical and Interreligious Engagement joined the synod assembly and offered an update from Churchwide. He offered a review of the social statements of the ELCA, reminding people that they are intended to "offer a theological and ethical framework for [people] to wrestle with [questions about important social issues]." He also shared that the ELCA is in active dialogue with the Roman Catholic Church and the Disciples of Christ to further ecumenical relations. Declarations have been authored to both the Muslim and Jewish communities. Rev. Santos also shared that the ELCA is actively involved in hundreds of new start ministries, though the ELCA is still trying to figure out how to sustainably do ministry in different settings, such as low-income areas.

There were four additional memorials (resolutions) brought before the assembly:

(1) A **Domestic Violence Task Force** will be created to work with the Presbyterians Against Domestic Violence Network. The task force will be charged with encouraging and holding accountable the domestic court judges to enforce the existing law requiring convicted domestic violence offenders to surrender firearms. The task force will also work to create workshops and resources to equip clergy and laity to identify signs of domestic abuse and to help address and prevent domestic abuse. (2) The synod council will direct the Committee of Appeals of the ELCA to **establish a clear and uniform process for investigating misconduct** within the church. (3) A Mustard Seed Initiative that will focus on **seed planting missions within each conference of the synod** was approved. (4) It was resolved that when **synod facilities are closed, consideration should be given to the giving of the building and land to "the descendants of those peoples, races, or nations that first lived on that land."**

The synod assembly also approved the proposed budget for 2023.
