## I recently started reading "The Amen Effect" by Rabbi Sharon Brous. I haven't made it very far in the book, but I'm already struck by an early theme that Brous introduces in the book that seems particularly relevant to our CAKE conversations. She summarized this theme in a maxim offered by her grandmother: "If, God forbid, you would fly in for the funeral, you'd better find a way to make it there for the wedding." Within the maxim is the rich ministry of presence. Life is full of ups and downs, twists and turns, but none of it is meant to be experienced alone. We are created in community. We are created to share our experiences with others - whether they are times of grief or hardship (like funerals) or times of celebration or joy (like weddings). And as church, we participate in the ministry of presence, of seeing others go through the ups and downs, twists and turns of life, and choosing to show up, to be present, to share in the experience of life and hold one another closely through all that life has to offer. As Brous says, "I have learned that human beings are, fundamentally, deeply relational beings with an innate yearning to be known. To be seen, imperfect and striving. To find our way through the forest together." People long for connection and community.

And that ministry of presence is at the heart of what we will explore through our CAKE conversations. As we declare ourselves a CAKE congregation, we commit to the ministry of presence, because we as St. John show up... with cake (or some other type of food). Baptism? Cake! People making a commitment to follow Christ through the ministries of St. John? Cake! Youth celebrating their first communion or affirming their baptism? Cake! Birthdays or Anniversaries? Cake! Graduations? Cake! Someone is experiencing a hardship in their life? Food is offered! Funeral? Food is provided! And we provide more food through the food pantry and the community garden. St. John shows up for the funerals and the weddings... with cake.

We provide food for the body at every opportunity with cake and other foods. Now the question is, what does it look like to show up, to offer the ministry of presence in all that life has to offer with CAKE – Christ-like Acceptance and Kindness for Everyone?

# Around the Synod Synod Assembly Recap

On June 12 - 14 the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA held a conference to elect our new bishop. David Dreher and Denise Hager represented our congregation at this conference. There were 289 delegates from 11 counties in PA voting over several ballots to finally come to a consensus. The result, on the fourth ballot, was the election of Pastor Melissa Stoller as our new bishop. The term is for six years. Pastor Stoller has been a pastor of several congregations and has also served as an assistant to Bishop Kusserow. Along with her election was the election of new members to the synod council. Throughout the conference were opportunities for worship as well as breakout sessions on Friday for delegates to hear talks on a variety of subjects regarding pastoral and congregational concerns. ## Installation of Bishop-Elect Stoller

The Rev. Melissa L. Stoller was elected on June 13 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod of the ELCA. She is the first woman to hold the position of Bishop in the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod. "In these liminal times, it is important that we strengthen our ties," Rev. Stoller said, "so that we may be Church together, communities of justice of hope, sharing the Good News with our neighbors."

Rev. Stoller has served as Director for Evangelical Mission and Assistant to the Bishop for the SWPA Synod since 2017. Prior to this role, she was Pastor at Zion Lutheran Church in Penn Hills, Pennsylvania, Trinity Lutheran Church in Cook, Minnesota, and Intern Pastor at the Moscow Protestant Chaplaincy in Russia. Before entering ordained ministry, she worked in housing and healthcare advocacy for the Minnesota Senior Federation. Her current synod leadership includes stewardship coaching, transitional ministry training, and vocational formation initiatives.

Rev. Stoller begins the work of bishop on September 1, and will be installed on Sat., October 18, 1 PM at Berkeley Hills Lutheran Church, 517 Sangree Rd, Pgh, PA 15237.

# **Stewardship Stewardship Corner**

Water is essential for all life, is a critical element of the global economy and, most importantly, holds a sacred place in our relationship with God. As stewards of all creation, protecting Earth's water is not optional. Water in its various forms is meant to meet the survival needs of all of creation around the globe. Yet typical fresh surface-water sources, such as rivers and lakes, only constitute a small fraction of all available sources. But globally, the water situation is dire. According to the United Nations: Eighty-five percent of the world's population lives in the driest half of the planet. Almost 2.5 billion people do not have access to adequate sanitation. 783 million people do not have access to clean water. The United States is not immune to the lack of clean water or access to it. Nearly 1 in 10 watersheds is stressed (University of Colorado) and people throughout the country lack drinkable water in their homes.

## To help steward our usage of water, think about these tips:

- Fix any leaks that may be in your home
- Turn off the tap while shaving or brushing teeth
- Make sure the dishwasher or clothes washer is full before running a load
- Know when and how much to water your lawn and garden
- Wash your car using a bucket or a commercial car wash that recycles water



Our little food pantry sees more usage than we sometimes recognize. Within the week prior to writing the newsletter, we had two individuals visit the pantry who we do not see on a regular basis. One person had bought extra groceries and stopped at the pantry on her way home to donate goods. Another person stopped by the pantry to collect items and was grateful for the opportunity to "shop" at the indoor pantry as well. When people are asked what goods they are most often looking for, they typically respond with items that are not covered by SNAP benefits (i.e. cleaning products, paper products, personal hygiene products) or easy to prepare meals.

## Adult Book Study - Real Faith for Real Life

During the summer months, we will engage in a book study to help us nourish our spiritual selves. We will meet monthly to discuss different parts of the book "Real Faith for Real Life" by Michael W. Foss. In this book, Foss invites readers to engage with the Marks of Discipleship (enumerated in his book as: daily prayer, weekly worship, daily Bible reading, serving beyond the congregation, nurturing relationships, and giving a tithe and beyond). "The Marks of Discipleship are spiritual aids that are biblical and have grown out of the tradition of the Christian Church," (pg 4). They are the practices of our faith that re-ground us in our call, our hope, and our joy," (pg 9). We meet on Wednesdays (7:00-8:30pm) and Sundays (6:30-8:00pm). It will be the same conversation on Sunday as on Wednesday each month. In June we discussed chapters 1 and 2. In July (July 23 and 27), we will discuss chapters 3 and 4. In August (August 20 and 24), we will discuss chapters 5 and 6. All conversations will be available in-person as well as on zoom.

## Messy Church – July 18th – NEW TIME
