I recently read a new book by Diana Butler Bass called "A Beautiful Year." The book is filled with over 50 brief reflections as Bass muses on the church's calendar, the patterns of the scripture read in worship throughout the year, and the themes that are enriched in our cyclical approach to telling the story of the good news of Jesus Christ and our response to it as church. The book begins with Advent, then follows the seasons of the church as Bass marvels at the way this calendar helps to deepen and enrich her faith. As I read the book, I realized in a new way just how much I love the church calendar and the way it invites us to slow down and really reflect on the story of God's good news come to us in Jesus and how God invites us to respond to and participate in God's work in this world.

We begin the year with Advent, when we look for the in-breaking of God's kingdom among us. We pray that God would prepare our hearts to celebrate Christ's birth and to receive him when he comes again. Then at Christmas we marvel at the presence of God with us, Emmanuel, born among us to dwell with us as one of us. After twelve days of dwelling in the marvel of the Christmas season, we celebrate Epiphany, when God's presence and good news is made known to the world far and wide through the wise men, and we spend the season after Epiphany exploring what difference Christmas makes for us today. We eventually move into Lent and Easter. We pause briefly at the festival of Pentecost, then there's the long season after Pentecost. And then we cycle right back around to Advent to experience it all again. Sometimes it can feel like these seasons blend indistinguishably one to the next, only marked by the festivals that begin each new season, but each of these seasons has their distinct value and purpose as we explore what it means to be a child of God, baptized in God's name in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. So what if we took a cue from the church calendar and spent time dwelling in the richness of each season? What if we allowed the seasons of the church calendar to invite us into a deeper connection not only with the story of God's good news born to us in Christ Jesus, but into a more intentional reflection on what it means to be a Christian now, participants in God's ongoing story of good news for all people?

As we dwell in the Christmas season for the first week of January and as we reflect on God's word made known and available to all people in Epiphany until Ash Wednesday in February, may we be open to the ways God is speaking to us in the ancient pattern of the church calendar.

### **Assistant Minister**

Help lead worship by reading scripture and prayers and assisting in the distribution of communion.

### **Greeter**

Greet people as they enter for worship and hand out bulletins.

### **Usher**

Ring the bell before and during worship, attend to lights and doors, and coordinate offering collection.

### **Bread Baker**

Bake or purchase bread to be used for communion during worship.

### *Worship Notes (continued)*

#### **What is Epiphany?**

Epiphany is **one of the oldest traditions** in the Christian church, dating back to the second century. From our liturgical resource, Sundays and Seasons: “The feast of Epiphany (“manifestation”) **concludes the Christmas season with a celebration of God’s glory revealed** in the person of Jesus Christ for all people. Like the light of the star that guided the magi to Jesus, the light of Christ reveals who we are: children of God who are claimed and washed in the waters of baptism. **We are sent out to be beacons of the light of Christ, sharing the good news of God’s love to all people.**” Epiphany is celebrated on **January 6<sup>th</sup>**, 12 days after Christmas. In worship, we will celebrate Epiphany on the Sunday following January 6<sup>th</sup>. Following the day of Epiphany, we observe the “**season after Epiphany**” until we begin **our Lenten journey** on Ash Wednesday, which this year is February 18<sup>th</sup>.

### St. John Food Pantry

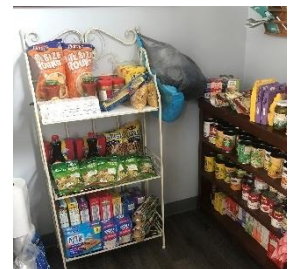


As Christians, we are called to love our neighbors as ourselves, and we do this by keeping the food pantry in good supply, even of thinking of items that might in some circles be considered "treats." On behalf of everyone who visits the pantry, thank you.

Please continue inviting people to make use of the pantry as needed! If you notice that the outdoor pantry is looking empty, **please move stuff from the inside shelves.** As the weather

drops below freezing more regularly, **please be aware of how any items might**

**store in freezing temperatures** (typically items with liquid should not be outside during freezing temperatures). Currently, Thursday morning is the most reliable time for access to the indoor food pantry (or times when there is a meeting or service at the church). If you know someone who needs access at another time, Pastor Katie is happy to coordinate a time to open the building for them. People who use our pantries have asked that we focus our offerings on **toiletries, cleaning supplies, and paper products as well as easy-to-make meals** (e.g., soups or other microwaveable meals). **We also have had several special requests for favored food items. These include Kellogg Raisin Bran, Lucky Charms, Carnation Instant Breakfast packets (vanilla), and pasta sauce.**

## Stewardship Corner from Stewardship of Life Institute

Many Christians think of “stewardship” only in financial terms, but money is only one of the gifts God entrusts us with – and it’s usually the one we value less than our gifts of time, relationships, faith and health. Make 2026 your year for holistic stewardship - and abundant living – by taking steps to care better for ALL the gifts God entrusts to us, including our finances. Here are tips.

**Health:** Get a physical and ask your doctor to help you to form a strategy for better living. For most of us, the plan would include eating better, exercising more and practicing wellness.

**Relationships:** We not only share love and joy with family and friends, but also turn to and rely on them in times of trouble. Care for your relationships with honest and frequent communication, get-togethers and sharing. Renew and repair relationships that need it.

**Time:** Are you just mindlessly counting the hours and days? Take charge of your time by planning events and activities that enrich your life. Plan for health and relationships.

**Faith:** No matter where you are on your discipleship journey, all of us can draw closer to God and open ourselves more fully to the Holy Spirit. For 2026, commit to regular worship, prayer, Scripture reading, devotions, service and other faith practices.

**Money:** Get your finances in order. Consider the 10-10-80 plan, budgeting your income to save 10 percent, give away 10 percent, and living on 80 percent.

God has given us so much. Stewarding the most important aspects of our lives can bring us into the life of abundance that Jesus promises us in John 10:10.

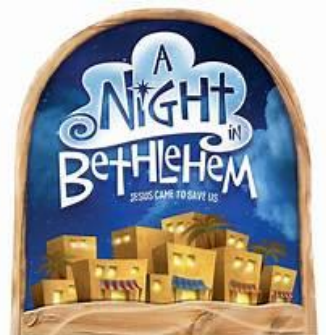

### **Messy Church – January 16**



**Messy Church is an intentionally intergenerational place for people to meet and experience fun and messy ways to engage in faith, including crafts and activities, celebration, and a shared meal no matter their connection to church. At Messy Church, we celebrate the creative, joyful God revealed in Jesus Christ.** Bible stories are explored in ways that invite our whole messy selves into God's story of the good news of Jesus Christ - that we are freed and forgiven in God's abundant grace and that God's love is for us, all of us. Come and bring your neighbors and friends to share in this interactive, creative, and celebratory worship service!

**We begin by eating dinner together at 6:00pm.** Then after a brief, interactive story-telling, activities are opened for families to explore together at their own pace in a flexible environment. At the end of the evening, we bring our whole selves - our hearts, voices, and bodies to celebration of God's creative goodness in praise songs and prayer, **ending at 8:00pm. In January, we will hear the story of Jesus' baptism, exploring what baptism means for us today.**

### **Communion Classes**

Each week, we give thanks to the ways God has moved in and through God's people across scripture before we remember Jesus' last supper with his disciples. **Communion class offers an opportunity for children and youth to hear the story of Jesus' last supper and its connection to the exodus in the Hebrew Bible.** We will explore the different supplies and practices surrounding communion as well as bake bread to be used at an upcoming worship service. **If you are interested in your child receiving their first communion this year at**

the Palm Sunday worship service, please contact Pastor Katie and dates will be selected for these sessions. The Lutheran church does not have a specific age at which communion is first offered. It is a decision to be made for and with each child and their family.



### **Adult Bible Study – The Book of Ephesians**

**Ephesians is an invitation into a world of grace, sweeping us into an all-encompassing vision of God's eternal plan to redeem all creation.** In this letter, we learn about the geography of grace where God labors to fulfill the mystery of the divine plan. Come and learn how the first listeners may have heard this letter and explore what the letter has to say to readers in the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

**This new series will begin on January 14 (Wed.) and January 18 (Sun.).** Bible Study meets on Wednesdays at 7:00pm and Sundays at 6:30pm. A Zoom option is available for both days. Material on Wednesday is repeated the following Sunday for those who need a flexible schedule.



## *Faith Formation (continued)*

### **Sunday Faith Formation Hour**

Each Sunday, we gather in the lower level of the building for Faith Formation for all ages. Hospitality is offered in the form of goodies and drinks. You are welcome to go downstairs immediately following worship and begin enjoying these goodies. At approximately 10:15am, we begin an all-ages together Bible game to help all of us develop greater familiarity with the Bible. At approximately 10:30am, people are invited to move into age-based groups to explore different topics as outlined below.

#### **Pre-K through 5<sup>th</sup> Grade**

The Pre-K through elementary classes will explore stories of Jesus' ministry through interactive storytelling and crafts. Students are asked to bring their Bibles to each class as they will be encouraged to find stories in their Bible, learning to mark their Bibles as they engage with the story. Students will be given a take-home sheet each week to help families continue the conversations at home. See below for a schedule of lessons to be covered each week this month:

**January 4** – Epiphany Celebration  
**January 11** – Baptism of Our Lord  
**January 18** – The Boy at the Temple  
**January 25** – Jesus Goes to Nazareth  
**February 1** – The Disciples

#### **Middle and High School**

A note from the teacher, Ruth Ann: "We use Bibles each session, and I am hoping students will bring their own personal Bibles. They will be encouraged to mark, highlight, and put notes in their Bibles for future assistance. Thank you for sending me these inquisitive young people. I will do my best to broaden their Biblical knowledge, connecting their faith to daily life."

Over the course of the year, students will explore the following topics:

- 1.) Do you believe in miracles?
- 2.) Stepping out of the boat, using the story of when Jesus and Peter walk on the water
- 3.) The seven "I am" statements of Jesus
- 4.) Mountaintop surprise – exploring the story of the Transfiguration
