Throughout the Easter season, we traditionally use a thanksgiving for baptism in place of the confession and forgiveness. We are baptized once, but we remember our baptism every single Sunday and throughout our daily lives. By the water and the Word in baptism we are joined to the death *and* the resurrection of Jesus. Baptism is a gift from God that we receive by faith alone. Baptism forms us together as a community of faith. Baptism begins our lives of discipleship. And so it is good and right that we should regularly give thanks for the gift we have in baptism, and in so doing remember who we are called to be in our baptism.

The charge above is from our baptismal rite. These are the promises made on behalf of a child being baptized and these are the promises we make when we affirm our own baptisms. So this season, as we weekly give thanks for the gift of baptism, I ask you: what parts of this baptismal covenant do you resonate with the most? What parts do you struggle with? And how do you live out these promises in your daily life?

I always tell confirmation students that these are very big promises made in baptism. But I also tell them that they are not alone in these promises. We have our community of faith to help support us in these promises. And we have God offering us the strength and courage needed to live into our baptismal promises.

Remember that you are God's beloved. Remember that you have been washed in the waters of baptism. Remember that in the water and Word of the sacrament of baptism you have been freed from the hold of sin and death. And let us give thanks for the gift of baptism.

As we hear these stories of new life in the resurrection, we will ask ourselves how we witness the resurrection. What's our resurrection testimony? How are we transformed by the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection?

Dinner Church - May 8th

What does it mean to be disciples, followers of Jesus? Perhaps the best place to tackle this question is at the table with Jesus. At Dinner Church, we meet Jesus at the table, the Lord's Table and the dinner table. Dinner Church is a worship service that interweaves Holy Communion, scripture and discussion, dinner, and community building. We begin at 6:30 and typically end around 8:30pm.

Pentecost Sunday - June 8

Pentecost marks the culmination of our Easter celebration as the **50**th **day of Easter**. We read the story of when **language barriers were broken down** and the Holy Spirit came down by way of tongues of fire after the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ. **This story marks the very beginning days of the Christian church and its mission in and to the world after Jesus' ascension**. Pentecost is therefore often called the "**birthday of the church**." We will celebrate Pentecost with red throughout the church and streamers to celebrate the joy of this celebration.



Serving Others St. John Food Pantry

Our little food pantry sees more usage than we sometimes recognize. Within the week prior to writing the newsletter, we had two individuals visit the pantry who we do not see on a regular basis. One person had bought extra groceries and stopped at the pantry on her way home to donate goods. Another person stopped by the pantry to collect items and was grateful for the opportunity to "shop" at the indoor pantry as well. When people are asked what goods they are most often looking for, they typically respond with items that are not covered by SNAP benefits (i.e. cleaning products, paper products, personal hygiene products) or easy to prepare meals.

2nd Quarter Mission Emphasis: Grapevine Center, Inc.

Grapevine Center, Inc. is an independent, non-profit organization based in Butler County that is consumer-operated and designed to support persons living with mental illnesses, struggling with homelessness, and reintegrating after recently being released from jail. Like most support groups, it offers a chance to share problems, advice, and ideas with others who have similar concerns in an atmosphere of understanding, empathy, confidentiality, and companionship. As an organization, it helps to secure employment, furniture, clothes, shoes, coats and food for people in need, regardless of their housing situation. Their building enables them to also offer aid through supplying basic needs like showers and hot meals as well as telephone and computer support. Grapevine Center also offers transportation to important appointments, like the social security office, court, and the grocery store. This organization offers a lifeline to help people stabilize their living situations, get back on their feet, and reintegrate into the community through learning opportunities, peer mentoring, and offering support for basic needs such as showers and hot meals. Adult Bible Study

It is a book that disturbs us and, especially given many popular interpretations, frightens us. The bizarre, confusing images, however, have inspired poets and artists, musicians and movie-makers. They also offer us glimpses into who Jesus is and who we are called to be in response. To help us navigate this text, we will explore the literary style of this book and how it speaks to our Easter season celebrations. The students created a timeline that we will use as the beginning of future Faith Formation space decorations. We wrapped up our discussion with a conversation about the cross and the depth of meaning we have in this symbol. We will have our final class for the school year on May 31.

Messy Church is an intentionally intergenerational place for people to meet and experience fun and messy ways to engage in faith and worship, including crafts and activities, celebration, and a shared meal no matter their connection to church. At Messy Church, we celebrate the creative, joyful God revealed in Jesus Christ. Bishop Eaton's Easter Message

In the Gospel story in the last Sunday in Lent, we hear about Jesus visiting with his dear friends, Martha, Mary and Lazarus. This happened just after Jesus had raised Lazarus from the dead. And Mary was anointing Jesus' feet with pure nard, this incredibly costly, precious substance. And then she dried his feet with her hair. Nard is a very powerful, pungent substance, and the Gospel says the room was filled with the fragrance.

Now I did a little research on nard, and some people would describe the smell as being pungent or earthy, or musty, or musky or like feet. So it was an interesting choice that people had in those days. And they did two things with nard. One, they would use nard to anoint the bodies of the dead in order to offset the stench of death, which Jesus had only encountered with his friend Lazarus a few days before. And it was also used for kings as a sign of royalty because of the luxury of this whole thing. Well, Jesus was himself, like us, like the first Adam, an earth creature — pungent and full of life, dense in this sense. And this earth creature was obedient to death, reversing the work of the first Adam, who disobeyed and brought sin into the world. And we've suffered the consequences. The chief consequence is death, separation from God.

And now Jesus, the new Adam, the new earth creature, he's anointed, he says to Mary, for his burial and so that he will be using this incredibly pungent substance, while at the same time being very clear that he is, in fact, part of this incarnation, this earth creature. But instead of it being oil put on him to remove the stench of death, it became the anointing of a royal king. Through the death and resurrection of Jesus, the usual cycle of life and death has been disrupted forever. Jesus' death and resurrection promises new life and brings us new life.
