Throughout Lent, I am participating in a sourdough group. (Almost) Every day in Lent (so far), I have carefully fed and tended my starter. I have baked a few loaves of bread. And I have asked a lot of questions! In the Facebook group and on the weekly webinars, there have been a few refrains throughout this process that have continued to buoy me as I practice making sourdough bread.

- There is grace here.
- Failure happens, learn and try again.
- No question is too small or strange

These refrains have not only helped me stick with my sourdough-journey but have invited me to reflect on what bread baking has to teach me about God, ministry, and the church community and the ways these refrains can carry us through our baptismal journeys.

There is grace here. God's grace is abundant and all-sufficient. It never runs out. God's grace wraps us in love and frees us to love God with all our heart, soul, and mind, and love our neighbors as ourselves.

Failure happens, learn and try again. We are human. We make mistakes. We fall short of God's call in our lives and in our community. We miss the mark on sharing the good news of Jesus Christ in our words and deeds. But each time we fail, we confess our failings, our sin to God, and we hear a word of forgiveness and an invitation to grow and learn and try again.

No question is too small or strange. Faith is tricky and sometimes confusing. Discipleship invites curiosity as we seek to follow Jesus. Bible stories are interconnected with thousands of years of story, history, and culture. And the church seems to have its own language that we don't use anywhere else. Questions demand to be asked. Whether you are brand new to faith and the church or you've been surrounded by it your whole life, questions abound. And there is no question that is too small or strange to ask as we learn together what it means to be a Christian today.

This Easter season, we will hear from voices of faith in Scripture. Each week of readings will bring us the witness of someone different as they offer their unique insight in seeking and encountering the risen Christ. And just as these refrains have emboldened me to continue my sourdough journey, we will hear these refrains throughout the season of Easter in each of the stories of these early witnesses. And hopefully they will embolden us in our baptismal journeys as we explore for ourselves our own insights and experiences in seeking and encountering the risen Christ.

Children's Bulletins

There is a lot that happens in a worship service! It can be hard for our young worshippers to keep track of everything. To help them **follow along every element of the worship service using age-appropriate language and activities**, we have children's bulletins that teach children about the full liturgy. There are stickers to go along with each level of reader. Our visually inclined young worshippers are invited to make shapes out of pipe cleaners following the prompts in the bulletins. Our students who are still learning to read are invited to practice finding and writing sight words. And our young readers are offered opportunities to learn more about each element of worship with notes explaining what to do for our newest acolytes. **Grab a bulletin for your young worshiper in the Greeting Area next Sunday!**

Worship Notes (continued)

Celebration of First Communion

The sacrament of the Lord's Supper is a powerful moment in the life of a Christian. In this simple meal is a declaration of grace and forgiveness and a rich story of God's presence throughout the ages. This year we will have celebrations of first communion on **Palm Sunday, April 13th** and on the **second Sunday of Easter, April 27th**. Come and support our young people as they partake in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, having learned what makes bread and wine/juice such powerful elements in this sacred meal, having heard the stories included in the celebration of the eucharist, and having explored what this sacrament means to us as Lutherans.

Lenten Worship and Study Schedule

Lent is a time for us, as Christians, to take extra time in prayer, devotion, and/or worship. We begin the season with ashes, remembering our humanity and mortality. Then, as we journey to the death and resurrection of Jesus, we **reflect on our faith and strive to deepen our connection with God and grow in our faith lives as disciples**. This year, we have multiple ways for people to connect with their faith lives each week. On Sundays we will have a traditional Bible study exploring the book of 1 Corinthians as we ask what it means to be a follower of Jesus as people new to the faith and people wanting to grow in faith. On Wednesdays we will have an integrated time of worship, dinner, and faith exploration as we Meet Jesus at the Table at Dinner Church. There will be a community luncheon and reflection series on Fridays in Lent as well.

Holy Week in Detail

Palm/Passion Sunday Worship: 9:00 am

Holy Week begins with celebration as we wave palm branches with Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. But we quickly become somber as we recall Jesus' suffering, death, and burial, preparing ourselves for the slower pace of the rest of the services during Holy Week.

Maundy Thursday Worship: 7:00 pm

This service brings us to the table where Jesus ate his last supper with his friends. We recall his shocking act of service as he washed the feet of his friends. We hear his instruction to love one another. We eat together the bread and wine, remembering the gift of life we are given in these mundane elements. And we prepare for the pending death of Jesus by stripping the chancel of all decorations to the words of Psalm 22.

Good Friday Community Lunch and Worship: 12:00 pm

We join with members of the community at Mars United Presbyterian for lunch and worship.

Good Friday Kids Cross Walk: 3:00 pm

We will explore the stories of Holy Week in a family-friendly manner that invites participants to actively engage in the story as we prepare to celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter morning. This free, all-ages together Holy Week storytelling event is open to all. Registration is requested at stjohnchurchmars.org/crosswalk. Register by April 3 for free T-shirts for each participant!

Good Friday Stations of the Cross Tableaux: 5:30 pm

Through frozen scenes of the passion of Jesus, we will dwell in the story of Jesus' betrayal and crucifixion, reading the passion according to the gospel of John, offering prayers, and meditating on the power of Jesus' willingness to die on a cross. Following the Tableaux, everyone is invited into the basement for a simple community dinner.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service: 7:00 pm

Tenebrae is an ancient service of light and shadow. We gather in subdued silence before joining our hearts in prayer. We reflect on the words Jesus spoke from the cross in the different gospels as candles are slowly extinguished, moving the sanctuary into darkness. A loud noise reminds us of the closing of the tomb before we remember God's continuing acts of faithfulness in the face of our repeated rebellion, praying for God's continued mercy following the pattern of Psalm 78. We end the service with a light of hope entering into the space.

Easter Vigil Worship: 7:00 pm

The Easter Vigil opens with strong, evocative language that declares the Easter Vigil as the culmination of Holy Week and as the center and apex of the baptismal life. We hear the ancient stories of our faith, proclaim the resurrection of Jesus in word and sign, remember God's promise at the font, and share the food and drink of new life. Raised with Christ, we go forth into the world, prepared to share the good news of the resurrection.

Easter Sunday Sunrise Worship: 6:30 am

As the sun breaks over the horizon, we worship with members of the community in God's creation, celebrating the new day and new life that is promised in resurrection.

(Note: Worship is at the Adams Township Park)

Easter Sunday Worship: 9:00 am

Come and hear the good news! Jesus is not in the tomb. He is alive! We sing our praises and celebrate the joy and life we know in resurrection!

We love supporting the faith formation and growth of our young people in worship! Serving Others

St. John Food Pantry

Our little food pantry sees more usage than we sometimes recognize. Within the week prior to writing the newsletter, we had two individuals visit the pantry who we do not see on a regular basis. One person had bought extra groceries and stopped at the pantry on her way home to donate goods. Another person stopped by the pantry to collect items and was grateful for the opportunity to “shop” at the indoor pantry as well. When people are asked what goods they are most often looking for, they typically respond with items that are not covered by SNAP benefits (i.e. cleaning products, paper products, personal hygiene products) or easy to prepare meals.

Harvest Street Mission

We will be serving some of the homeless and food insecure population of Pittsburgh on Sunday, April 13th. Preparing and packaging of the meals will happen on Saturday, April 12th. Sign up to participate in this ministry in the greeting area

2nd Quarter Mission Emphasis: Grapevine Center, Inc.

Grapevine Center, Inc. is an independent, non-profit organization based in Butler County that is consumer-operated and designed to support persons living with mental illnesses, struggling with homelessness, and reintegrating after recently being released from jail. Like most support groups, it offers a chance to share problems, advice, and ideas with others who have similar concerns in an atmosphere of understanding, empathy, confidentiality, and companionship. As an organization, it helps to secure employment, furniture, clothes, shoes, coats and food for people in need, regardless of their housing situation. Their building enables them to also offer aid through supplying basic needs like showers and hot meals as well as telephone and computer support. Grapevine Center also offers transportation to important appointments, like the social security office, court, and the grocery store. This organization offers a lifeline to help people stabilize their living situations, get back on their feet, and reintegrate into the community through learning opportunities, peer mentoring, and offering support for basic needs such as showers and hot meals. To make an offering to the mission emphasis, mark your envelope “mission emphasis.”

Faith Formation

Adult Bible Studies

In the Easter season, a new Bible study series will begin after a week off. **The Easter season offers us two very rich topics of study.** Throughout Easter, **our second reading will come from the book of Revelation.** This book is full of vivid imagery and is often the inspiration behind many creative writing opportunities. We can explore the literary style of this book and how it speaks to our Easter season celebrations. **2025 also marks the 1700th anniversary of the writing of the Nicene Creed.** This creed was even used at one point to resolve a debate that divided the church for over 1,000 years. The Nicene Creed offers a rich study for the scripture that informed the creed as well as the historical context in which it was written. Stay tuned for the final topic of discussion! Faith is hard. Discipleship can be confusing. Find a community of support at one of the new small groups beginning after Easter! Small groups are a great place to form deeper relationships with God and with one another as people as you engage your faith and your baptismal identity with other people. Small groups may meet in people's homes, in restaurants or coffee shops, or at the church depending on the needs of the group. Splashers

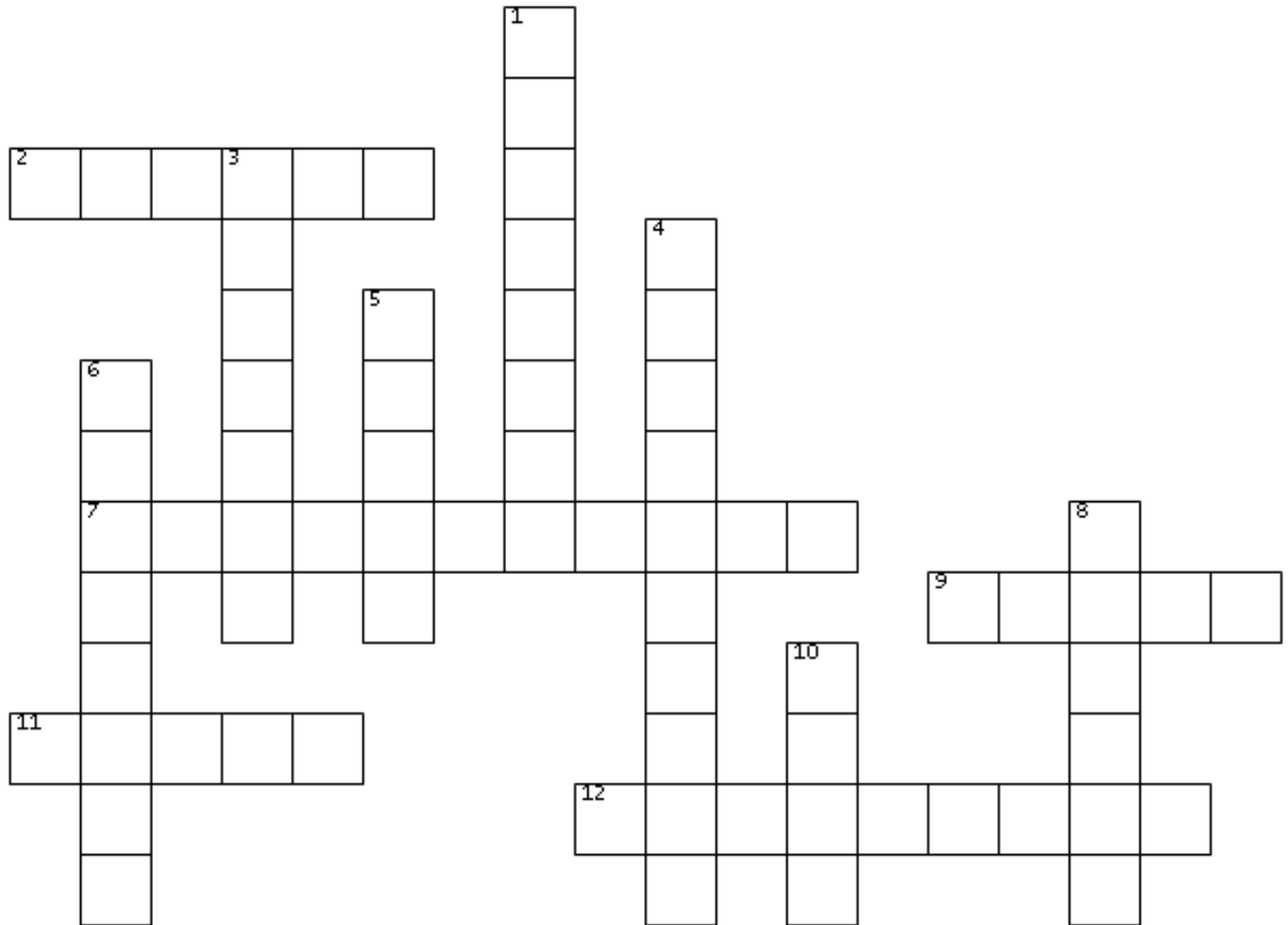
