How many times have you heard the story of Jesus' birth? Even those unconnected to church know a lot of the basics of the story. It's a story that is told and retold in countless ways. In many ways it is a familiar, comfortable story, yet there is still something about the story and the season in which we hear it that invites our imagination, that brings us to awe, and that surprises us. No matter how well we know the stories of the angel visiting Mary and Joseph, of the angels meeting the shepherds in the field, of the journey to Bethlehem, of the wise men seeking the newborn king, there is still much that surprises us in this season.

From the very beginning of Creation, God has always intended good for Creation. From the very first time humans strayed from God's good intentions for them, God has planned reconciliation, redemption, and restoration for all of humanity. Throughout the Hebrew Scriptures, God sends the message that God is with the people at all times. God has told the people that God promises salvation for the people. And yet, when God shows up, we are still surprised by God's boundless mercy as we celebrate the reign of Christ by reading the story of his crucifixion, as we remember the times God has brought life out of places we only saw death, and as we celebrate God's incarnation in an infant boy in the arms of a poor woman in a small Judean town.

As we begin the new liturgical year with the beginning of Advent, we begin our journey of meeting our surprising God in Christ again through the Gospel of Matthew. While we do not read the very beginning of this gospel in worship, Matthew invites us to hear the story of Jesus through the lens of a genealogy that roots Jesus' life, death, and resurrection in the ancient story of God's people. We hear names we know well from the Hebrew Scriptures: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Jesse, David, and Solomon, yet tucked between these names are names of women who were outsiders to the Israelite people, women whose stories were surprising inclusions: Tamar, Rahab, Ruth, Bathsheba. Over and over again, God shows up in ways that are surprising, yet completely in keeping with who God has shown God to be for and to the people across the ages. Advent is the season when we try to expect the unexpected, to prepare for that which we cannot prepare, – that God would be incarnated, enfleshed, and born among us, calling us to and providing us with life in new and surprising ways.

Throughout the season of Advent, we will consider what we know... and just as often what surprises us... about what it means to follow God. Throughout the coming Advent and Christmas seasons, there are many opportunities for us to open ourselves to God's known, yet surprising, presence with and among us. Come and worship and encounter how God is showing up in ways that are familiar and yet surprising in scriptures, in our community, and in your life.

Outreach Ministry - How to Invite Someone to Church

Each Sunday in Advent, we will be passing out invitations to Christmas Eve worship at St. John Lutheran Church. But what do you do with 2 invitations to Christmas Eve worship... every week? You invite people! There are many ways you can invite people to worship. You can take the little cards and leave them someplace for people to find: a bulletin board, a table in a well-traveled area at work, someone's front door, "accidentally" left behind at a coffee shop... be respectful, but be creative! However, the most effective invitations are those that are extended personally. Tell them why worship on Christmas Eve is important to you. Tell them how it changes your experience of the holiday. And hand them the card and invite them to come. Tell them which service you will be attending if they want to come with **you.** Offer to drive together if it's feasible. Offer to meet them in the parking lot so that you can walk in together. Offer to sit with them during the worship service. People might say no. They might have other plans for Christmas. They might not be quite ready to come to worship. But the first invitation is just that, the first invitation. You can always invite them again later. Sometimes it takes seven invitations before a person decides to come and see. But if we each invite two people every week in Advent, imagine how many people will be touched by the good news of God coming to earth in the person Jesus. Imagine how many people will hear about how your faith impacts your life. Imagine how many people will hear that their presence in worship is wanted. Imagine.

And if you want more than two invitation cards per week, there will be a stack in the Gathering Area. Take as many as you want and enjoy inviting people to come and know the joy of Christmas as we celebrate it on Christmas Eve at St. John Lutheran Church.

Congregation Meeting Notices

Vestry Election – Sunday, December 14, 2025

Vestry elections will take place following the worship service. The congregation will be asked to vote on the slate for the 2026 Vestry.



All Vestry Meeting - Tuesday, December 16, 2025

All persons elected to serve on the vestry (Boards of Deacons,

Elders, and Trustees) are asked to attend an all-vestry meeting on Tuesday, December 16th at 7:00pm to elect chairpersons and secretaries for each board as well as council representatives and officers. During this meeting, a one-day vestry retreat will be scheduled for the beginning of the calendar year.

Annual Meeting - Sunday, January 18, 2026

We will review 2025, vote on a budget for 2026, approve the congregational council for 2026, and look forward to what ministry might look like at St. John in 2026. The congregational meeting will be held after the worship service.

The Boards

St. John is run by three boards, the Deacons, the Elders, and the Trustees. We also have a Mission Endowment Fund Committee and a Mutual Ministry Committee. Each December we elect individuals to serve on each of the boards and the Mission Endowment Committee (the Mutual Ministry Committee is filled by appointment). Though there is often some overlap, each board has its primary areas of responsibility. The **Deacons** are largely responsible for visiting the homebound, overseeing stewardship practices and events, and planning fellowship opportunities. The **Elders** are largely responsible for Christian education and faith formation, evangelism, and worship life within the congregation. The **Trustees** are primarily responsible for taking care of the physical property of the church and overseeing the finances and budget. The Mission Endowment Committee listens to the community and disburses funds collected as interest on an account set aside for mission support. As we elect individuals to serve in these different roles as congregational leadership in December, we hold them and their work in our prayers.

From our liturgical resources, Sundays and Seasons: "One of the best-known customs for the season is the Advent wreath. The wreath and winter candle-lighting in the midst of growing darkness strengthen some of the Advent images found in the Bible. The unbroken circle of greens is clearly an image of everlasting life, a victory wreath, the crown of Christ, or the wheel of time itself. Christians use the wreath as a sign that Christ reaches into our time to lead us to everlasting life. The four candles mark the progress of the four weeks of Advent. Sometimes the wreath is embellished with natural dried flowers or fruit. Its evergreen branches lead to the evergreen Christmas tree."

4th Quarter Mission Emphasis: Butler Hospital The Food Institute

Food insecurity impacts people throughout the community, and food insecurity often leads to a higher prevalence for diseases, obesity, and other measures that are tied to poor health. Food insecurity can happen due to a disruption of food intake because of lack of money or other resources. Neighborhood conditions may affect food insecurity, but food insecurity can happen anywhere. Some people experience food insecurity for just a short time; others are in a chronic state of insecurity. To support this community need, The Food Institute was created to make nutritious meals a reality for more families in the region.

How it works:


- Your doctor provides a referral for the Food Institute.
- Referral includes one monthly visit for four months.
- Each monthly visit lasts about 45 minutes where you will:
 - o Receive a nutrition lesson
 - Learn healthy eating on a budget
 - Leave with nutritious food and recipes for up to 10 meals

How you can help:

St. John Food Pantry

We have had several new individuals and families stopping by the food pantry. Though they frequently come outside of office hours, we are able to stop and talk with them occasionally. Each time we talk to someone who is utilizing the gift of the little food pantry, they are simply grateful for whatever it is we are able to offer. When we have a variety of food and essentials, we are able to help people find something that particularly brings a smile to their face – their favorite cereal brand or soap fragrance or a snack that they would not have the luxury of purchasing for themselves. We would not be able to have such an offering if it were not for the generosity and care of members of this community. As Christians, we are called to love our



neighbors as ourselves, and we do this by keeping the food pantry in good supply, even of thinking of items that might in some circles be considered "treats." On behalf of everyone who visits the pantry, thank you. Please continue inviting people to make use of the pantry as needed!

Currently, Thursday morning is the most reliable time for access to the indoor food pantry (or times when there is a meeting or service at the church). If you know someone who needs access at another time, Pastor Katie is happy to coordinate a time to open the building for them.

Stewardship

Stewardship Corner

How do you steward your time? What about your relationships? December is often a very busy month for people, and that busyness can add stress to our relationships. The late Rev. Sharron Riessinger Blezard of the ELCA offered these thoughts in an article first published November 25, 2015, entitled "Stewardship in Advent Series: Give Thanks"

"Even if we are suffering from illness, loss of job or financial stress, broken relationships, depression, or stress, we are still called to give thanks. And in giving thanks and expressing our gratitude, we may experience attitudes shifting, circumstances becoming more manageable, and hope rising like the winter sun. So yes, begin in prayer with praise and thanksgiving....

Give thanks for those around you, for your church community, your family, your friends, and coworkers. Initiate small and simple acts of gratefulness. When was the last time you wrote a note of appreciation to your spouse? How long has it been since you've praised your child simply for being unique and worthy as God's child? When did you last thank your server or grocery store check-out clerk for a job well-done? Be on the look-out during this season of Advent for ways to connect with both those you know and those whom you encounter in your daily comings and goings. Finally, take action. Prayer, gratitude, and connection lead to action. If you see someone in need—whether it's material, relational, or emotional—take a simple step to meet that person's need. How could you mark each day with a simple act of gratitude? It could be a smile to a harried shopper. It might be a note of thanks and a gift card for your mail carrier. It could be the anonymous purchase of a cup of coffee for the person behind you in line. Or it could even be skipping your own cup of daily coffee to make a special offering through your congregation....

This year enter Advent with prayer and Thanksgiving. Focus on building relationships rather than credit card debt. Do random acts of kindness and generosity rather than stressing over the perfect Christmas. Lift up your soul to God and watch your spirits lift in response. Know this... I give thanks for your faithful witness and partnership in sharing the gospel. You are in my prayers."

Faith Formation

Adult Bible Study - Titles of Jesus (December)

Come and explore the varied ways in which Christ comes to us and how traditional titles and imagery from scripture helps us to connect with Jesus in our Christmas preparations.

Throughout the series we will explore titles for Christ that are drawn from the Hebrew Bible, hearing them as an opportunity to enrich our own understanding and connection with Christ and hearing them in the Jewish context in which they originated and in which they are still treasured. The same readings will be used on Wednesday and the following Sunday.

On **Wednesdays**, we will gather at **6:30pm for a light supper** while we openly discuss scripture readings related to the topic of the evening. At approximately **7:20pm, we will move to the sanctuary for sung evening prayer** with the readings of the evening read in worship. Worship will conclude at approximately 8:00pm.

On **Sundays**, we will have our **traditional Bible Study format beginning at 6:30pm**. We will study the texts that support the various titles of Jesus used in the Advent season with our typical outline of notes.

Because of the different formats of Wednesdays and Sundays, you are welcome to come to one or the other or both as you like! Due to the nature of Wednesday evenings in this series, **only Sundays** will be offered via zoom in addition to in person.

Kids Club/Youth Group - December 7 and 14

Adult Bible Study - The Book of Ephesians (January)

Ephesians is an invitation into a world of grace, sweeping us into an all-encompassing vision of God's eternal plan to redeem all creation. In this letter, we learn about the geography of grace where God labors to fulfill the mystery of the divine plan. Come and learn how the first listeners may have heard this letter and explore what the letter has to say to readers in the 21st century.

This new series will begin in January. Stay tuned for the specific start date. Bible Study meets on Wednesdays at 7:00pm and Sundays at 6:30pm. A Zoom option is available for both days.

Sunday Faith Formation Hour

Each Sunday, we gather in the lower level of the building for Faith Formation for all ages. Hospitality is offered in the form of goodies and drinks. You are welcome to go downstairs immediately following worship and begin enjoying these goodies. At approximately 10:15am, we begin an all-ages together Bible game to help all of us develop greater familiarity with the Bible. At approximately 10:30am, people are invited to move into age-based groups to explore different topics as outlined below.

A note from the teacher, Ruth Ann: "We use Bibles each session, and I am hoping students will bring their own personal Bibles. They will be encouraged to mark, highlight, and put notes in their Bibles for future assistance. Thank you for sending me these inquisitive young people. I will do my best to broaden their Biblical knowledge, connecting their faith to daily life."

An Advent Activity



Attention glue gun slingers and craft store fanatics, have I got a project for you!

Go find five tealight candles, five mason jars, a small box, some blue or purple paint, glue, and something to use as a base (think of the cardboard base of a frozen pizza).

Then paint four of the mason jars blue (or three purple and one pink), glue them onto the base, and put tea lights inside the jars. Then set the box in the center and put the Advent Centerpiece Wreath you've just made in a place of gathering in your home or a place you regularly spend time (i.e., a dining table).

Next to the Advent Centerpiece, place a stack of small papers and a pen to be used throughout the coming Advent season.

As many times as you'd like throughout the week, do as follows:

- Between November 30th and December 6th light one tealight, and consider the following question: "What has made me hopeful about the future this week?" Write down or draw what you all come up with and put it into the box. As you put your paper in the box, pray for God to continue to offer you hope in your life.
- Between December 7th and 13th light two tealights, and consider the following question:
 "Where have I found peace this week?" Write down or draw what you all come up with and put it into the box. As you put your paper in the box, pray for God to continue to offer you peace in your life.
- Between **December 14**th **and 20**th light three tealights, and consider the following question: "What has given me **joy** this week?" Write down or draw what you all come up with and put it into the box. As you put your paper in the box, pray for God to continue to offer you joy in your life.
- Between December 21st and 24th light all four tealights, and consider the following question: "Where have I found love?" Write down or draw what you all come up with and put it into the box. As you put your paper in the box, pray for God to continue to offer you love in your life.
- Then, on Christmas morning or any of the **12 days of Christmas** before Epiphany on January 6th, remove the box, replace it with the 5th mason jar and tea light. **Light all five of the candles and read through all the hope, peace, joy, and love** accrued over the season of Advent! All a blessing come to full fruition in Christmas!
