The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. **And also with you.**


Hear the words of scripture:

A reading from James.



The holy gospel according to Matthew.


Glory to you, O Lord.

¹The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.


²He makes me lie down in green pastures;



And also with you.


Lift up your hearts.

forever and ever. Amen


*INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Grape juice and gluten free wafers are available upon request. Communion may also be brought back to the pews for those who are unable to come forward.


COMMUNION SONG Lamb of God

Notes for the day's texts:

Marks of the Christian community include praying for those who are sick and in need, celebrating with those in good health, restoring those who have strayed, confessing sins to one another, and offering forgiveness to each other. The passage from James impels us to examine our practice of prayer, which here is focused on communal healing, not on personal situations. The Elijah reference reflects early monotheistic beliefs, according to which any cosmic event, even weather, is produced directly by God.
