I have been watching a lot of the show "The Great British Baking Show." At this point, I've watched each series available for streaming several times through. Yet I'm still always astonished at what the bakers can do... especially with cakes! And it's not just about how they decorate it! There are many more kinds of cake than I ever knew. Each cake is made up of the same basic ingredients, but slight changes in the ratio of the ingredients, how the ingredients are mixed together, and how it is baked can have drastic effects on how the judges describe the final product. And that's not including the flavor combinations that the contestants develop! From the little interviews they do throughout the show, the contestants spend lots of time in trial and error as they figure out what tastes good together and what doesn't. They experiment and fail and try again, hoping for to discover the recipe that is unique to them and will earn them accolades from the judges. It's a lot of work, but for each of them, it is a work of passion – to create something beautiful and delicious that they can share with others.

At the beginning of the year, the vestry came up with the acronym CAKE to describe the culture we want to embody as St. John Lutheran Church. We are striving to show Christ-like Acceptance and Kindness for Everyone. At the beginning of the summer (beginning June 22), we will have a summer worship series that will help us explore our unique style and flavor of being a CAKE congregation. Like the cakes on "The Great British Baking Show," there are basic elements that most congregations have as bodies of Christ, welcoming people as Christ has welcomed us. However, each congregation will put these elements together in different ways and at different ratios; they will introduce their own flavors and personal touches; and they will present it to their surrounding communities differently. St. John is a CAKE congregation – we accompany people through different milestones of faith and life with cake at every opportunity and we strive to offer **C**hrist-like **A**cceptance and Kindness for Everyone. What specific kind of CAKE we are, what flavors we choose to use in our CAKE, and how we present it to the world are unique to us, and I'm excited to spend some time this summer developing our CAKE recipe together!

Bake or purchase bread to be used for communion during worship.

Graduate Recognition

We joyfully give thanks for the ways God has nurtured them and helps them grow into who they are and are becoming, but we know that people are pulled in many different directions during this time of year, especially as our graduates navigate this time of transition. In response to their varied schedules, we will be celebrating our high school and college graduates during worship as they are available.

Summer Worship Series

Throughout the summer, we will be focusing our worship services on a couple of different topics. We will begin our summer with a series exploring what it means to us to be a CAKE (Christ-like Acceptance and Kindness for Everyone) congregation. This will include a sermon series exploring different expressions of being a welcoming and hospitable congregation along with discussion questions congregation members are encouraged to explore during a fellowship hour after church or throughout the week.

More information will be coming, but after Vacation Bible School we will have another worship series tackling the hard questions offered by congregation members this past Advent.

Serving OthersSt. John Food Pantry

Our little food pantry sees more usage than we sometimes recognize. Within the week prior to writing the newsletter, we had two individuals visit the pantry who we do not see on a regular basis. One person had bought extra groceries and stopped at the pantry on her way home to donate goods. Another person stopped by the pantry to collect items and was grateful for the opportunity to "shop" at the indoor pantry as well. When people are asked what goods they are most often looking for, they typically respond with items that are not covered by SNAP benefits (i.e. cleaning products, paper products, personal hygiene products) or easy to prepare meals.

2nd Quarter Mission Emphasis: Grapevine Center, Inc.

Grapevine Center, Inc. is an independent, non-profit organization based in Butler County that is consumer-operated and designed to support persons living with mental illnesses, struggling with homelessness, and reintegrating after recently being released from jail. Like most support groups, it offers a chance to share problems, advice, and ideas with others who have similar concerns in an atmosphere of understanding, empathy, confidentiality, and companionship. As an organization, it helps to secure employment, furniture, clothes, shoes, coats and food for people in need, regardless of their housing situation. Their building enables them to also offer aid through supplying basic needs like showers and hot meals as well as telephone and computer support. Grapevine Center also offers transportation to important appointments, like the social security office, court, and the grocery store. This organization offers a lifeline to help people stabilize their living situations, get back on their feet, and reintegrate into the community through learning opportunities, peer mentoring, and offering support for basic needs such as showers and hot meals. We offer the produce to our neighbors in need and see to it that nothing goes to waste. You may not be able to do everything possible in your space, but is there one practice you can adopt this summer to be a better steward of the piece of creation under your care?

Around the Synod

2025 Synod Assembly - May 17 (online) and June 12-14 (in person)

Voting members from our congregation have an important responsibility on behalf of all the members of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. This assembly is the highest legislative authority of our synod; they will be making decisions that impact 143 congregations covering 10 counties in southwest PA. This year, those decisions include the election of a new bishop for the synod.

At the opening of assembly on May 17th, names were brought forth for consideration for the position of bishop. Further ballots will take place in June. heart of our synod; we encourage congregations to take a special offering to send along with its voting members. 2025 Offering Designation: The Levi Fund is a new synod fund created in honor of Bishop Kurt Kusserow's tenure as our synod's bishop. In Numbers, the Lord told Moses, "Bring the tribe of Levi near, and set them before Aaron the priest so that they may assist him." It was a demonstration that leaders do not work alone. And so by underwriting the salaries of critical synod staff positions, the goal of the Levi Fund is to ensure that our next bishop is able to have the necessary support to fulfill the duties of the office. Adult Book Study - Real Faith for Real Life

During the summer months, we will engage in a book study to help us nourish our spiritual selves. We will meet monthly to discuss different parts of the book "Real Faith for Real Life" by Michael W. Foss. In this book, Foss invites readers to engage with the Marks of Discipleship (enumerated in his book as: daily prayer, weekly worship, daily Bible reading, serving beyond the congregation, nurturing relationships, and giving a tithe and beyond). "The Marks of Discipleship are spiritual aids that are biblical and have grown out of the tradition of the Christian Church," (pg 4). They "are the practices of our faith that re-ground us in our call, our hope, and our joy," (pg 9). Presently, the schedule is to meet on Sunday evenings, 6:30-8:00pm. Depending on scheduling requests, we may either switch days or add a second option. As of now the reading schedule is: discussing chapters 1 and 2 on June 29th, chapters 3 and 4 on July 27th, and chapters 5 and 6 on August 24th.

Messy Church - June 20th



Messy Church is an intentionally intergenerational place for people to meet and experience fun and messy ways to engage in faith and worship, including crafts and activities, celebration, and a shared meal no matter their connection to church. At Messy Church, we celebrate the creative, joyful God revealed in Jesus Christ. Faith formation topics and Bible stories are explored in ways that invite our whole messy selves into God's story of the

This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the Council of Nicaea at which the Creed was formalized. This series will explore the historical context of the authorship of the creed, including the teachings it guarded against, and some of the scriptural basis of the statements made throughout the creed. Sunday School Recap

The 2024-2025 St. John Lutheran Church Sunday School year came to a close on Sunday, May 18th. We marked the end of the year with our traditional beautification project of planting flowers in pots and placing them at each of the main entrances to the building. Many thanks to Mars Agway and Chuck O. for donating plants and time to this effort.

Let us take a look back and review the year beyond the Flower Planting though. We started with Rally Day, where we got the kids (and grown-ups!) sugared up with ice cream. Animal Friends visited our class to kick off our tithing campaign and brought a puppy for the kids to enjoy. They explained to our kids how to properly approach a dog, that we should always ask the owner if we can pet their dog, and that dogs love to sniff and lick us! Over the course of the year, we collected \$272.54 for Animal Friends, along with a small tote of food and toys for the animals in their care to enjoy.

Our standard class routine of opening, music, story, craft, and snack was often intermixed with cake, which kept things fresh and new. Ruth Ann Tully maintained a schedule of meeting with the Confirmation class students throughout the year while the younger children were in class. The fact that we, as a Church Community, have a place for our children of all ages to spend time learning about and growing in their Faith is a true blessing.

As we moved into Advent, Maizy led the kids in a bell choir for the Christmas season in a manner that still amazes me. How she gets 10 kids to play bells and make music without them just clanging away noisily and chaotically is a mystery to me! As we entered 2025 and the Lenten Season, our classroom setting pivoted away from the Lectionary readings and towards learning the story of Moses. We started with Moses as a baby being placed in the river for Pharaoh's Daughter to take him in. We then moved to Moses confronting Pharaoh to tell him God's demand to "Let my people go," followed by the 10 plagues, the Exodus story, the parting of the sea, and the 10 Commandments. Over the course of five consecutive weeks, we drilled into detail and created a picture board each week on the chalkboard. It was wonderful watching the kids learn and visualize this story, and they did an amazing job remembering it from week to week! Many thanks to Emma Niklewicz, who organized crafts for the kids during this session and helped throughout the entire year. What a wonderful blessing she is to our Congregation!

During this time, Pastor Katie introduced the kids to a few new sing-along songs, which the kids really enjoyed. I remember one Sunday when they were belting out the song louder than I have ever heard them sing. It was wonderful to just stand back and watch joyful noise being made to God from such young souls!

Easter brought with it the opening of our Alleluia box, where the kids had the opportunity to decorate the walls of our church with Hallelujah signs. In early May, the Kids Club and Youth Group partnership between St. John Lutheran and Mars United Presbyterian worked on a Youth-led worship service held at MUP. All the kids did an amazing job leading us in worship that day.

As we enter the summer, we plan to meet and discuss how we want our physical classroom space to be decorated and organized. Denise Hagar, Pastor Katie, Beth Fitzgerald, Ruth Ann Tully, and I already had a brainstorming session, and I am excited to see where those ideas take us as we move into the 2025-2026 school year.

For now, I want to say thank you to all who helped bring the Word of God to our kids these past nine months. Denise Hagar, who keeps me on track and organized and who cares deeply for our children. Emma Niklewicz, who, as mentioned above, has grown into an amazing example of Faith and Service. Ruth Ann Tully, who gives our older children a place to voice their questions and stretch their Faith. Beth Fitzgerald, who brings a wonderfully positive attitude to story time each week. These folks make possible the things we do for our kids, and it is by their dedication to the Sunday School program that we get to see our young children grow into the amazing adults we are celebrating this month as graduates of both college and high school.
