Throughout our mini-stewardship series, we are asking the question of "why is church important?" And so I ask you that question. Not "why is *faith* important?" But why is *church* important? Why is it important that we exist as the institutional, organized church of St. John?

To answer this question might look like considering the ministry and service the church does. It might look like considering the ways the church has fed and nourished you in your life. It might look like any number of things. But it's a question worth considering. There is no one right answer. That's part of the beauty of church. We come together from a multitude of places in life, and we come together to gather at the cross and celebrate God with us.

I was recently at a continuing education opportunity where the speaker encouraged us to come up with an "elevator speech" for church. If someone on the street asked you why do you go to church, or why is church important to you, or what is it about the gospel, the good news, that speaks to you, what would you say? In 50 words or less, how would you summarize what church is to you? Or, alternatively, in 50 words or less, what is the message of the church?

So I pass along that challenge to you. It's harder than you might think! And to add to the challenge, I'd encourage you to think how this elevator speech would sound to someone who has either never been in church or has not been in church for a while. When you come up with these statements or stories, I invite you to share them with me! I'd love to share them on our website, if you're comfortable with that!

Ash Wednesday - February 22

ASH WEDNESDAY We begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday. Marking our foreheads with ash (dust), we remember that we come from dust, and to dust we shall return. At the same time, the ash traces the life-giving cross marked on our foreheads at baptism. We mark Ash Wednesday in the church with a service of Holy Communion and the Imposition of Ashes at 7:00 pm in the sanctuary.

For those who are unable to come to evening worship, Pastor Katie will be available in the church for prayers and to offer ashes and communion between 10:00 am and 1:00 pm.

<u>Lenten Mid-Week Worship – Wednesdays in Lent (March 1 – March 29)</u>

Lent is a time for us, as Christians, to take extra time in prayer, devotion, and/or worship. We begin the season with ashes, remembering our humanity and mortality. Then, as we journey to the death and resurrection of Jesus, we **reflect on our faith and strive to deepen our connection with God**. This year, we are **focusing on the many questions of faith**: the questions we have in scripture, the questions we have about our faith, the questions we have about God and life. This year, we will have **two opportunities for midweek worship, fellowship, and discussion**.

Serving Others

First Quarter Mission Emphasis Project

Victim Outreach Intervention Center (VOICe) is a private, nonprofit organization located in Butler County that provides services to
any victim of domestic violence, sexual assault or other crimes.
Their services are also available to family and friends of those who
have been assaulted. Many people believe that VOICe only provides
support services to woman, this is untrue. They provide advocacy
services to those in Butler County regardless of age, gender, race,
color, religion, culture, national origin, sexual orientation, and
economic status. The range of services provided is extensive,
including, but not limited to crisis intervention, advocacy-based



counseling, emergency housing, legal advocacy...all services are confidential and free. If you have need of their services, the emergency 24-hour hotline is available at 1-800-400-8551.

St. John Food Pantry

Our food pantry has been seeing an increase in usage. If you notice that the outdoor pantry is looking empty, please move stuff from the inside shelves. As the weather drops below freezing more regularly, please be aware of how any items might store in freezing temperatures. People who use our pantries have asked that we focus our offerings on toiletries, cleaning supplies, and paper products as well as easy-to-make meals (e.g., soups or other microwaveable meals).

Burying the Alleluias in Lent

The omission of alleluia during Lent goes back to at least the fifth century in the western church. Because of the penitential character of the season of Lent in the Western church, the word "alleluia" has been historically suspended during Lent. This period of individual and congregational reflection on the quality of our baptismal faith and life suggests that the joyful nature of alleluia is more appropriately reserved for our Easter celebrations.

Help us prepare to bury the alleluias on Transfiguration Sunday (February 19th) by picking up an Alleluia card to color and bury. The colored alleluias will be brought back out on Easter!
